ITINERARY

Day 1- 20 May 23: Adelaide to Johannesburg Depart Adelaide to Johannesburg via Perth with Qantas. Meet Tullie at Adelaide airport early this morning for our flights to Johannesburg - South Africa, on arrival we will be transferred to the Peermont Metcourt for the night. (1 night)

Day 2 - 21 May 23: Johannesburg to Windhoek After breakfast we are transferred back to Johannesburg International Airport for our flight to Windhoek, Namibia. On arrival into Windhoek we are transferred to our overnight accommodation Olive Grove Guest House, small upmarket accommodation situated close to the city center.

(1 night) (B)

Days 3&4 - 22/23 May 23: Windhoek to Onguma Game Reserve. After breakfast we depart Windhoek and we travel north stopping at the large open air market of Okahandja with its many local wood carvings. Mid afternoon we arrive to our lodge on the edge of Etosha National Park. The park's main characteristic is a salt pan so large it can be seen from space. There is abundant wildlife that congregates around the waterholes. Etosha NP is one of the most important reserves and game sanctuaries in Africa with thousands of wild animals such as wildebeest, springbok, zebra, kudu, giraffe, cheetah, leopard, lion and elephant making this area their home. Late afternoon we enjoy our first game drive in open 4x4 vehicles into the Park from our lodge. Day four we explore the many waterholes during morning and an afternoon 4x4 game drives inside the Eastern sector of the Park. Onguma Bush Camp - relax and cool off around the swimming pool or the new water-level hide will provide hours of game viewing opportunities for guests. Dinner is served overlooking a large waterhole where you can enjoy watching the game coming to drink.

(2 nights) (D,B)

Day 5 - 24 May: Onguma Bush Camp to Okaukuejo Resort in Etosha's south. The trip is a full days game drive across the park in our overland vehicle. We travel via Halali Restcamp and stop at the famous Etosha Pan. **Okaukuejo Resort** is famous for its flood-lit waterhole, where visitors can observe at close quarters a spectacle of wildlife congregating and interacting.

(1 night) (B,D)

Day 6/7 - 25/26 May: Okaukuejo Resort to Mowani Mountain Camp. We travel south through Damaraland to our lodge huddled in the rocks, with sweeping views across the Aba Huab valley. On our second day we depart early to explore the surrounding area and search for the desert-adapted elephants and desert black rhino. Climb into an open-air vehicle and experience the rush of Africa. Mowani's local guides share with their guests an intimate knowledge and respect for the land that they have built up over a lifetime. With new insight into local traditions, you will come to fully appreciate the geology, botany and wildlife of the area. Local villagers are welcoming and keen to share their experiences. After lunch we head to the famous UNESCO World Heritage Site of Twyfelfontein to explore the rock engravings, along with seeing Burnt Mountain and the Organ Pipes. **Mowani Mountain Camp** offers luxury tented accommodation with magnificent desert views. Open air en-suite bathrooms and private decks give you great views of Damaraland. Guides from the local tribes compliment day-time game drives to track mountain zebra, kudu, springbok, klipspringer and if you are fortunate enough...the leopard! (2 nights) (B,L,D)

Day 8/9 - 27/28 May: Mowani Mountain Camp to Swakopmund. We travel south through Damaraland and arrive at Swakopmund the capital of the Skeleton Coast. We will spend the afternoon and following day exploring this German colonial town. On day two after breakfast we depart on a dolphin cruise. You will see an abundance of sealife, pelicans and seals up close and delight in the sea air, great food with fresh oysters and bubbles. **The Delight Swakopmund** is located just a 5 minute walk from the beach. (2 nights) (B)

Day 10/11 - 29/30 May: Swakopmund to Dead Valley Lodge. Our journey takes us south through ever changing scenery to our accommodation located on the edge of the Namib Desert inside the National Park. Before entering the Park we visit Sesriem Canyon. On the afternoon of arrival we hike up Elim Dune for a spectacular sunset over the Namib Desert. The following morning is an early departure for Sossusvlei, stopping in the dune belt to witness the changing colours of the world's highest sand dunes. We undertake a 5km walk to Sossusvlei and Deadvlei. Dead Valley Lodge this oasis offers a panoramic view of the Namib Desert with towering red sand dunes, rugged mountain ranges, and arid desert savanahs.

We will be staying in luxury tented chalets Guests can enjoy the top-class restaurant that serves delicious Namibian-style cuisine, relax in the picturesque bar with a cold drink after a day of activities, or cool off in the open-air swimming pool overlooking the Elim Dune. Dead Valley Lodge is one of the closest lodges to Sossusvlei pan. (2 nights) (B,D,B,L,D,B)

Day 12 - 31 May: Dead Valley Lodge to Windhoek We depart Dead Valley lodge after breakfast and travel back to **Olive Grove Guest House** in Windhoek. This evening we will enjoy a farewell dinner at Joes Beerhouse sampling some of the local cuisine. (1 night) (B,D)

Day 13 - 1 June: Windhoek - Johannesburg - Perth After the trip of a lifetime it is time to say goodbye to Namibia! This morning we will be transferred to the airport for our flight to Johannesburg. From Johannesburg we will connect with our flight back to Perth and Adelaide. (B)

Day 14 - 2 June: Arrive Perth with a connecting flight back to Adelaide.
